When officers arrived on the scene to investigate the crash, they started a DUI investigation based on the behavior of the driver, and she was arrested.

While Gulfport Fire Department Engine 17 was responding to the above crash, it was hit head-on by a Jeep Liberty driven by Greg Kovacs. Kovacs lost control of his vehicle on wet pavement when the car in front of him stopped for the fire truck. His vehicle slid from the westbound curb lane across the center land, and hit the driver's side front end of the engine.

Detective Pham continued working his assigned cases. He suspended an attempted retail theft at the Family Dollar store due to lack of leads, and located and identified a suspect in a credit card fraud case. He is also gathering evidence to develop probable cause for the arrest of the suspect.

Sheriff's Office, which stated there were no prints of value taken in a grand theft he is currently working, and is currently attempting to locate a suspect in a fraud case he is working.

Crime Analyst Palmisano worked in records for 10 hours. She also completed the Domestic violence follow-up quality control check, open Problem Oriented Patrol list, and open case list.

School Resource Officers Beltran and Motte are on vacation this week due to Boca Ciega High School being closed for the holidays.

Sergeant Burkhardt assisted St. Petersburg Police Homicide detectives in a suspicious death involving a male boater who resided on a boat in Boca Ciega Bay. It appears that the boater's dingy capsized while the victim was making his way to or from his boat. The body was located behind a residence in the Broadwater area along 46th Avenue South. Foul play has been ruled out, however an official cause and manner of death will not be officially determined until the Pinellas County Medical Examiner's office is able to review the toxicology report which usually takes 6 to 8 weeks. The boater's next of kin has been notified.

The Marine Unit was used 2 hours this week to assist St. Petersburg Police Homicide Detectives inspect a boat on Boca Ciega Bay.
